The UCPR Annouces the Creation of an Innovative Food Hub in Eastern Ontario

NEWS RELEASE - L'Orignal, April 22, 2020

The **United Counties of Prescott and Russell** (UCPR) announced the creation of an innovative food hub in Eastern Ontario. In partnership with the private sector, the UCPR will build a federal slaughterhouse, with food processing and distribution capacities, in order to meet the needs of regional and national markets.

This \$36-million project will create 65 jobs and will be located in one of the UCPR's municipalities, to be unveiled shortly, according to certain criteria. A potential expansion is planned in order to satisfy international demand.

"It is time for municipalities to launch innovative projects that will generate new revenue streams that will help cover municipal expenses with funds other than government subsidies and property taxes. Furthermore, the UCPR will be the majority shareholder of this agri-food company," stated UCPR Warden Pierre Leroux.

This business model, unique in Canada and perhaps worldwide, is modelled in part on American food hubs where producers send their cattle to slaughter, after which they are packaged and distributed in a predetermined market. This project is unique here because all types of meats and vegetables will be processed.

Research has also confirmed that retailers and consumers are increasingly interested in buying quality and traceable local products. The food hub will therefore take the lead in the recovery and revival of agri-food in the region, particularly following the Covid-19 pandemic.

Agri-Food Open for E-Business - Targeted Intake

A programming initiative under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership

The Agri-Food Open for E-Business initiative will help food producers, farmers markets, retailers, garden centres, greenhouses, nurseries, and agricultural associations develop online business, providing consumers with greater access to a wide variety of food and agriculture products.

This targeted application intake features two funding streams:

- 1. Bring Your Business Online. Eligible organizations and businesses can apply for a grant of up to \$5,000 to establish an online e-business and marketing presence. Funding under this stream will be quick and responsive for those needing immediate solutions.
- 2. Develop Online Business Opportunities. Eligible organizations, businesses and collaborations can apply for cost-share funding of up to \$75,000 to implement high-impact projects."
