Ontario East to Welcome New Directors at Annual General Meeting in February

The Nominating Committee of the Ontario East Board of Directors submitted three candidates for nomination to the Board of Directors earlier this month. Three (3) valid nominations were received by Active Members for replacement of two (2) retiring Active Member directors.

Subsequent to the Call for Nominations process a director resigned as an Active Member director to take a position where he will now be a Government Member of Ontario East. The Nominating Committee recommended that all three nominees be accepted and brought forward to the Annual General Meeting (AGM) in February for final approval by the Voting Members.

The Active Member complement on the Board will remain at eight (8) along with two (2) Associate Members, in accordance with the bylaws of the Commission.

It was not necessary to conduct an election this year as the nominations aligned with vacancies. The following nominees will be recommended for appointment at the AGM:

Women's Virtual Entrepreneurship Incubator Pilot Project - Update

The Ontario East Women's Entrepreneurship Program (WEP) was launched in late summer 2019 and is funded by the Government of Canada's Women Entrepreneurship Strategy (WES) through the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario). The three year program is administered regionally under the guidance of the Ontario East Economic Development Commission and delivered locally by the pilot partners in Northumberland County, Kawartha Lakes, Leeds & Grenville, Prescott Russell and Durham Region.

WEP delivers business development tools, resources, methods and mentoring in a virtual environment to help women start and grow their businesses. The project moved existing "in-office" resources to online meeting and collaboration tools to reach women entrepreneurs at their locations.

The pilot project pre-dated the COVID-19 pandemic where the use of such virtual tools as Zoom, Webex, Microsoft Teams, Google Meets, Facebook and others are now common place.

As we approach the midway point of the program, the results continue to be very positive, despite the challenges of the pandemic. We are pleased to share some key performance indicators (KPIs) on the project to date. The intent of the pilot is to test the model and then expand to other communities in Ontario East region and beyond pending future funding.

Key Project KPI's To Date:

- 69 New entrepreneurs supported in starting a business
- 69 Jobs Created
- 20 Entrepreneurs supported in expanding growing an existing business
- 169 Virtual learning networking & mentoring opportunities
- 91% Extremely or very satisfied with the Program (Participant Survey Results)
